Election regulations

§ 1

Elections may only be held if they are due in accordance with the Articles of Association and have been announced with the agenda (agenda items).

§ 2

The election committee, which consists of the chairperson, two assessors and two substitutes, is responsible for organising the elections. The election committee is elected by the meeting prior to the election.

§ 3

Prior to the elections, the election officer requests that the actions of the Executive Board be approved, which is done by means of an en bloc vote for all members of the Executive Board. At the request of the meeting, the vote can also be taken separately.

§ 4

Nominations must be submitted verbally or in writing to the election officer. The election officer determines by questioning whether the candidates are standing for election.

§ 5

At the request of the General Meeting, the candidates must briefly introduce themselves orally. If one third of those entitled to vote request a personnel debate, this must take place.

§ 6

An absentee may be elected if the election officer has received a written declaration prior to the vote that he or she is prepared to accept the office if elected.

§ 7

If a member of the Election Committee is nominated for an office, he or she shall resign for the duration of this election process. The first-named substitute shall take his or her place.

§ 8

The election of the 1st Chairman must be conducted by secret ballot and in writing. The candidate who receives more than half of the valid votes cast is elected. If no candidate achieves this majority, the ballot is repeated. A simple majority of the valid votes cast is decisive.

§ 9

Further elections are also held in writing and by secret ballot. If there is only one candidate for an office, elections can be held by acclamation (show of hands) if the meeting decides so by a simple majority. In the event of a tie, the election must be repeated; if the vote is tied again, the election is decided by drawing lots. Feldenkrais Network International e.V. Page 2

§ 10

If more than one person stands in a ballot and no one achieves a simple majority of the votes cast, a run-off vote is held between the two candidates who received the most votes in the first ballot.

§ 11

The election result must be determined by the election committee and announced to the general meeting. Its validity must be confirmed in writing for the minutes.

§ 12

If the elected person is present, they are asked by the election officer whether they are prepared to accept the election. If written consent has been given, this is valid.

§ 13

These election regulations shall enter into force upon their adoption at the General Meeting on 21 April 2012 in Würzburg and may be amended as required, irrespective of the Articles of Association.
